## Wildcat Service Cord Program

The mission of the School District of Belleville is to provide all students with quality, personalized learning that prepares them to meet current and future challenges and opportunities of the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

One of the district's goals is to increase community engagement and communication. In an effort to encourage students to serve others and invest in their community, Belleville High School staff has implemented a **Wildcat Service Cord Program**.

Through this program, students will develop their leadership and citizenship skills while benefiting the school and community.

The Wildcat Service Cord Program will recognize students who have made contributions to their community through service. Seniors who have completed the required number of hours of volunteer service during their high school career will be awarded a Wildcat Cord and will be recognized at graduation.

### Phase-in of the Wildcat Service Cord Program

***\*It is recommended that underclassmen complete 35 hours annually to stay on pace.***

| Class of _____               | Hours required before senior year | Total number of hours required |
|------------------------------|-----------------------------------|--------------------------------|
| 2017 (Seniors)               | 35                                | 70                             |
| 2018 (Juniors)               | 70                                | 105                            |
| 2019 (Sophomores) and beyond | 105                               | 140                            |

***Students are required to complete and turn in (to the High School Office) the service hours that they accumulated prior to their senior year by September 15. Service hours completed during students' senior year must be completed by May 1 so that they can be totaled and cords can be ordered.***

Students may begin accumulating hours during the summer before their freshman year. **Forms are available on the High School Intranet and in the High School office.** Grades 9-11 should turn their forms into the High School Office to the Associate Principal. Seniors should return their forms to the Graduation Coordinator before May 1st.



# Wildcat Service Cord Program

## Approved Service Opportunities

Volunteer activities must meet the following requirements to earn the honor of wearing a Wildcat Service Cord during graduation:

- All activities must be completed before and after school hours.
- You must perform a service for someone **other than family members and relatives**.  
Activities that will NOT be approved include:
  - Those for which you are paid or compensated.
  - Chores or babysitting at home.
  - Court-ordered community service.
- Service should be **in addition to your required hours of service** in clubs such as Boy Scouts, Girls Scouts, 4-H, church youth groups, National Honor Society, etc.
